Departing from Guatemalan educational data and diagnostic studies, this presentation provides an analysis of the limiting and enabling factors of the educational trajectories of a grandmother, a mother, and a daughter from the artistic Curruchiche family of Comalapa. Their links with weaving are also examined in terms of learning model, aesthetic and affective appreciation and economic income. The roles of formal education and traditional weaving are wrapped in a final intergenerational reflection on both as means of life in the community past and future.

Partiendo de datos educativos guatemaltecos y de estudios diagnósticos, esta presentación ofrece un análisis de los factores que limitan y de los que facilitan las trayectorias educativas de una abuela, una madre y una hija de la familia artística Curruchiche de Comalapa. También se examinan sus vínculos con el tejido en términos de modelos de aprendizaje, apreciación estética y afectiva, y generación de ingresos económicos. El papel de la educación formal y del tejido tradicional se integra en una reflexión intergeneracional final sobre ambos como medios de vida en el pasado y el futuro de la comunidad.

We have arranged transportation to take you to La Finca Azotea for the closing breakfast on Saturday. Breakfast starts at 10:00 AM, and buses will leave Antigua at 9:30 AM. Buses will return to Antigua at 1:00 PM.

If you want to stay longer or return earlier, you can arrange your own transportation. From Azotea, it is about a 2.8 km (1.75 mile) walk to Antigua's central plaza. A local chicken bus costs about Q4, a tuk-tuk about Q20, or you can use Uber.

Azotea is a working coffee farm with restaurants, cafés (including a beer garden), small museums, walking paths, and bike rentals. If you want to stay and explore longer, you are welcome (and encouraged!) to do so.

Buses will leave for Azotea from the behind the Antigua bus terminal at 9:30 AM on the dot. The exact location is el Mástil de la Recolección and the buses will have signs labelled SCCR. The terminal is west of the municipal market. From the conference venue, walk west on 5th Calle or 4th Calle until you reach a busy divided road. Cross the road (carefully) and continue past the market to the bus terminal. SCCR volunteers in green shirts will be along the route to help guide you.
